

WHAT IS WOOD BADGE?

Wood Badge is advanced leadership training for all adult leaders who serve in the Boy Scouts of America. Across the Nation, Wood Badge brings together the men and women who serve as mentors for Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops, Varsity Teams, Venturing Crews, and Explorer Posts in one dynamic course designed to be informative and helpful for all participants.

The objective of Wood Badge is to teach the aims and purposes of Scouting for the ultimate purpose of improving units. It is a six day course, split into two weekends, in duration, and is a multifaceted presentation of leadership skills, organizational tools, and participatory activities based on the best of Scouting traditions and the latest in team development theory. In addition, participants will enjoy the fellowship and learning alongside many other volunteers and professional Scouters, and most of all, have a lot of fun! Most participants find that the lessons and leadership skills learned at Wood Badge are not only useful for Scouting, but are also useful in their professional and personal lives.

Successful completion of Wood Badge will consist of completing the six day course, and completing the Wood Badge Ticket. Upon completion of the Ticket, participants will then receive a certificate of completion, a Wood Badge neckerchief, a leather woggle, and two small wooden beads to be worn proudly around the neck with their Scout uniforms.



DO I HAVE TO "WORK A TICKET?" WHAT IS IT?

Yes, if you wish to complete your Wood Badge training, and earn your beads. A Wood Badge ticket is a simple contract that you write, detailing how you will continue to serve your unit using the principles and skills you have learned on course. You write your own personal ticket to help you on this journey. It is not a Master's thesis or a final exam, so there is nothing to fear.

TWO WEEKENDS? IS THAT A LOT OF TIME?

Depends on how you look at it. How much time are you already spending with your Scouting unit? Do you feel it is time well spent? Would you like to invest a few days that will teach you advanced leadership skills and techniques, so you may lead the youth in your unit better? Are you willing to invest 6 days to learn information that will not only impact your ability as a leader, but also the rest of your life? However you look at it, complete participation is essential for your own growth in the program.


WHO MAY ATTEND?

All Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity, Venturing, Exploring, Unit and District Committee volunteers, as well at Council volunteers and professional staff are encouraged to register. Each participant must have completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position, and if applicable, the outdoor skills training course for their position.

Registration is limited to the first 48 participants to sign up, so register early!

WHAT ABOUT A UNIFORM?

A full, complete Scouting uniform from your program, will be worn during the course. NO EXCEPTIONS! Your uniform should be outfitted with the U.S. Flag, home Council strip, and the International World Crest. All other patches that you normally wear (i.e. square knots, O.A. flaps, current position patches) should remain on your uniform.



WOOD BADGE: A BRIEF HISTORY

In 1919, Lord Baden-Powell, the founder of Scouting, along with the financial support of W. de Bois Maclaren, purchased 55 acres of land known as Gilwell in East London. The first Wood Badge course was held later that year, from September 8th to 19th. At the conclusion of the course, Baden-Powell gave each of the participants one of the beads which he had captured from the African chieftain Dinizulu. Thus did the course name develop, for its symbol was literally a badge of wood.
